- 8.3 Consideration of County of Los Angeles Negotiated Tax Exchange Resolution (NTER), related to the annexation of the territory known as Petition No. 70-1019. This resolution authorizes the County of Los Angeles and GLACVCD to collectively approve and accept the negotiated exchange of ad valorem property tax revenue resulting from the annexation of the subject territories identified in the resolutions to provide revenue to the County Lighting Maintenance District

(CLMDs) 10006. A copy of the letter from the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works requesting this resolution is attached. (EXHIBIT C)

Analysis: The NTER from the County of Los Angeles is similar to previous L.A. County tax sharing resolutions and seeks to generate revenue to partially fund the services of CLMD 10006. Similar resolutions have previously been adopted by the Board. These Petitions relate to funding for the operation and maintenance of new street lighting services for properties in Los Angeles County. Although the District gives up a negligible share of its ad valorem property taxes in these exchanges, in subsequent years, that amount would generally be regained, if not exceeded, due to an increase in property values associated with services provided by the CLMD.

8.4 Review and consideration of District's FY 2021-2022 Investment Policy and **Resolution 2021-09**. *(EXHIBIT D)*

Trustee Sanabria made a motion to approve the consent agenda. The motion was seconded by Trustee Appleton and approved unanimously.

9. PUBLIC HEARING & ADOPTION OF THE FY 2021-2022 MINIMUM BENEFIT ASSESSMENT AND VECTOR SURVEILLANCE AND CONTROL PROJECTS ASSESSMENT RATES

Summary: This public hearing and discussion follow the June 10th Board approval of the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget and Assessment Report which includes 1) staff's recommendation to increase the district-wide "minimum benefit assessment rate" (MBAR) to \$14.67, generating \$16,687,637 in estimated benefit assessment revenue for FY 2021-2022, and 2) maintaining the existing \$0.33 per parcel black fly assessment rate, generating \$101,638.02 of the estimated benefit assessment revenue within the black fly assessment zone.

The Board of Trustees regularly conducts a yearly hearing regarding adoption of its annual general benefit assessment rate. This year, the Board of Trustees intends to consider adoption of **Resolution 2021-10**, regarding increasing the district-wide "minimum benefit assessment rate" (MBAR) at \$14.67 and maintaining the black fly assessment rate at \$0.33 in order to secure operational funding for fiscal year 2021-2022.

9.2 Presentation of 2021-2022 Engineer's Report by SCI Consulting Group. *(EXHIBIT E)*

President Heinrich welcomed John Bliss from SCI Consulting Group who provided a brief report on the District's assessment rate. John Bliss offered to answer questions from the Board.

9.5 Discussion and consideration of **Resolution 2021-10**, "A Resolution of the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District Board of Trustees Determining the Rate of the Assessment for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 in Connection with Vector Surveillance and Control Projects of Common Benefit to the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District as a whole and of benefit to Zone A." (EXHIBIT F) (VOTE REQUIRED)

Adoption of this Resolution formalizes acceptance of the District's minimum benefit assessment rate (MBAR) contained or modified within Resolution 2021-10 to be made effective for fiscal year 2021-2022 and placed on the County Assessor's tax roll for collection effective July 2021. The justification and support for adopting the MBAR is contained in the District's "Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget" and Assessment Report.

Trustee Santa Ines inquired what the County's percentage of the assessment rate was, but John Bliss did not have that quantity at hand and would report back. However, despite the cost, Bliss shared that the County provides administrative services and act as a collection agency that has the authority to place a lien on a property to help collect the assessment rate.

President Heinrich called for a motion. Trustee Bollman made a motion to adopt Resolution 2021-10. The motion was seconded by Trustee Sanabria and approved unanimously.

10. CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION 2021-11, "A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GREATER LOS ANGELES COUNTY VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT IN CONNECTION WITH THE COLLECTION OF AD VALOREM TAXES NECESSARY TO OPERATE THE DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022." (EXHIBIT G) (VOTE REQUIRED)

General Counsel Barrow initiated Closed Session. Upon return, it was reported that the District's Board went into closed session to engage in labor negotiations. The Board gave direction to the labor negotiator and General Counsel suggested that it would be appropriate for the Board to consider adopting a resolution approving an amendment to the General Manager's contract.

Trustee Croft shared that the amendment would establish a new three-year contract with a 10% increase in the first year, and a COLA plus 1% increase in the second and third year as of July 1, 2021.

Trustee Santa Ines made a motion to approve the revised contract for the General Manager. Trustee Croft seconded the motion and passed unanimously.

12. STAFF PROGRAM REPORTS: June 2021

12.1 Manager's Report

T. Dever, General Manager

General Manager Dever thanked the Board of Trustees for the approval of her new contract and the confidence the Board has placed on her leadership. Additionally, she mentioned that the District will be working on adding Juneteenth to the list of holidays given to staff members. Lastly, Governor Newsom's Executive Order allowing the Board to hold virtual board meetings would end on September 30th and Trustees should plan on returning to in-person meetings starting in October.

- 12.2 Scientific-Technical: (Staff Report A) S. Kluh, Sci.-Tech Services Dir. Director Kluh thanked the Board for their support of the budget that allows the District to continue their work. To date, the District has not identified any positive mosquito samples within the District boundaries. However, West Nile virus has been detected in the San Gabriel Valley, so the District remains vigilant.
- 12.3 Operations (Staff Report B) M. Daniel, Operations Dir. Director Daniels thanked the Board for their support of the budget and shared how the department would be able to purchase the supplies they need to do their work.
- 12.4 Community Affairs (Staff Report C) M.J. Coburn, Communications Dir. Director Coburn reported the progress of the District's summer campaign and the multiple cities and agencies that have shared it to their residents. Director Coburn thanked Trustee Medina for facilitating the partnership between the District and the City of Gardena. The District's collateral will be featured on Gardena's bus routes at no cost to the District. Lastly, Director Coburn shared the latest PSA for the department's Mosquito Watch Program.
